# Please elaborate on how you demonstrate support for the right to privacy and reproductive freedom.

My commitment to privacy and reproductive freedom is unwavering. I believe that everyone has the right to make decisions about their own body and to have their privacy respected. As councilmember, I will fight to protect these fundamental rights through advocacy, legislation, and community support. I will ensure that Oakland is a place where everyone's rights are respected and upheld.

Please elaborate on the LGBTQ+ support you have from your community and what pro-LGBTQ+ policies you will work to advance (or anti-LGBTQ+ policies you will fight) if elected to this position:

First, our community has been directly supporting me since the majority of my staff and kitchen cabinet self-identify as LGBTQ+. Additionally, I am working with LGBTQ+ organizations and businesses to help spread the campaign's message and provide volunteers; some of those include local venues like The Good Hop, Oakland's drag festival Oaklash, and Bay Area Black Queer Men's Brunch, which I co-founded, among others.

When it comes to pro-LGBTQ+ policies, my focus is on helping our unhoused population of which a significant number identify as LGBTQ+, developing small businesses in my district which is home to the majority of Oakland's LGBTQ-owned and allied businesses, and providing support to grow and expand the newly-established Lakeshore LGBTQ Cultural District beyond the policy guidance I am already providing to their leadership board.

If we are truly going to live up to our ideals as a Sanctuary City then we need to accept new residents into our community and the best way to do that is to expand the amount of affordable rental housing available.

#### Please briefly describe your background and why you are running for this office:\*

I've spent my life seeing how governments have often ignored the real needs in our communities. As a gay black man, I see it every day. That's why I pursued an undergraduate degree in Urban Studies and then earned my Masters in City and Regional Planning from UC Berkeley because I believe cities must do better for all of us.

My work for over a decade has been making policies, designing projects, and developing programs for cities around the Bay Area and across the county in times of need. As one of Oakland's emergency directors during the city's response to COVID-19, 2020's massive wildfire season, and the power shutdowns, I served as the City's Emergency Community Resilience Director, where I led an interdisciplinary team that fast-tracked community testing and vaccination sites, directed departments to work collaboratively, and helped small businesses take advantage of outdoor merchant programs. And it got done in just weeks – not years.

I'm running for Oakland City Council District 3 because I feel our city is on the wrong track. Neighbors continue to share concerns about public safety, homelessness, and pollution. We deserve a representative who responds to us and can deliver meaningful changes that help our residents, workers, and business owners. I know what it takes to make change effectively, and I'm ready to serve as the next Oakland City Council Member for District 3
